OUR PHILOSOPHY

- **Empowerment/Whakamana** – Through our curriculum children are empowered as interactive learners with control over their own learning. Our curriculum is largely based around children's own interests and they are supported and encouraged through a journey of discovery. We aim to offer a rich and positive learning environment, which stimulates children's learning, within which children can freely and safely explore.
- **Holistic Development/Kotahitanga** – Our curriculum encompass' all dimensions of children's learning and development, considering the child as a whole, fostering respect for themselves and each other, and our beautiful environment.
- **Relationships/Ngā Hononga** – We foster warm, positive, responsive and reciprocal relationships with the children, valuing and scaffolding their learning and encouraging children to do the same with each other.
- **Family and Community/Whānau Tangata** – We recognise that the centre is an important meeting place for parents/caregivers and extended family and friends. Their involvement is valued and encouraged. Our centre is very much part of the Pauanui and Hikuai community and believe strongly in the importance of fostering these relationships.

OUR PROGRAMME:






We work within the framework of Te Whāriki which is our national early childhood curriculum. We follow an emergent interest based programme by providing unlimited opportunities for children to build more complex knowledge around things that interest them, to work both co-operatively and independently, to problem solve, practise social skills, question, and hypothesise.

As part of our philosophy we strive to provide a homelike environment that is rich in open ended equipment and materials, which empower thinking, open up possibility, inspire creativity and provoke thought. Within this rich learning environment children's interests are fully supported and extended with numeracy and literacy incorporated within the course of the day.

STAFF RATIO'S

We pride ourselves on providing quality early childhood education and work within the Ministry of Educations minimum staff to child ratios. We maintain a minimum 100% registered teacher to child ratio.

We have a maximum of 5 under 2s enrolled on one day and 20 over 2s. The Ministry of Educations minimum requirement for this number of children is 3 teachers. We have 4 teachers on the floor with the children at all times.

FEES – ENROLLED CHILDREN

ENROLLED FEES

\$6.00 per hour for all enrolled children

FREE 20 ECE

Children 3 and 4 years old will be free for their first 20 hours of enrolment up to 6 hours per day.

QUALITY EDUCATION SURCHARGE (QES) FOR CHILDREN RECEIVING 20 HOURS FREE ECE

Pauanui Pre-School provides education and resources at a higher level than required by Early Childhood Regulations. In order to continue to provide these additional resources we request a donation of \$1.50 per hour (up to 20 hours maximum \$30 per week) for children enrolled in 20 hours ECE.

The optional charge is for:

- Transport to school visits.
- Provision for paper based learning portfolio
- Sunscreen & Sunhats
- Higher teacher to child ratios than regulated by the Ministry of Education

Once you opt in to paying the optional charge of QES it becomes an ongoing fee. In order to opt out of paying this fee you must provide at least 2 weeks' notice in writing to cancel the agreement due to hardship.

CHANGES TO ENROLMENT

To change your hours of enrolment please provide as with as much notice as possible. If you wish to decrease your hours two weeks' notice is required.

PERIODS OF CLOSURE

Summer Closure - Pauanui Pre-School closes for 4 weeks over summer at the end of Term 4.

Mid-Year Closure – Pauanui Pre-School closes for 1 week during the second week of the July School Holidays.

No fees are charged for periods of closure when the centre is closed.

HOLIDAYS AND ABSENCES

We charge fees for every enrolled day of our operating year, including absences and statutory holidays.

APPLICATION FOR HOLIDAYS

Each child can have a maximum of 3 weeks per year for a family holiday at no charge. This is allocated on a pro - rata basis. Holidays may not accrue. Please provide us with at least 2 weeks' notice by emailing the centre to apply for holidays at no charge.

PAYMENT OF CHILDCARE FEES

We invoice fortnightly, two weeks in arrears. Payment is due within 7 days of invoice date. We encourage all parents to pay by setting up a regular automatic payment.

OVERDUE PAYMENTS

Payment plans are available for all overdue fees – please see the administrator to arrange this. If your fees are 90 days overdue you may be charged 5% of the overdue balance each fortnight.

WINZ CHILDCARE SUBSIDY

You may be eligible for a WINZ childcare subsidy to assist with your Pre-School fees. Please see our friendly office staff who will facilitate your application.

EARLY / LATE FEES

If you drop your child off earlier than your usual booked time or pick your child up later than your booked time you will be charged the normal hourly rate for any hours attended outside your child's enrolled hours. Late pick up after 3pm – if you collect your child after 3.05pm you will be charged \$1 per minute you are late. If you collect your child after 3.15pm a one off late fee of \$30 will be incurred in addition to any other late fees incurred.

MINIMUM ENROLMENT

We suggest a minimum 2-day enrolment to encourage and allow children to develop a strong sense of belonging in the centre.

CASUAL ENROLMENTS / VISITORS

We offer short term casual enrolments on a case by case basis. Please enquire with us today.

Visitors/Casuals with children under the age of 3 must stay with their children.

Casual fees are \$9/hr

MANAGEMENT / PARENT COMMITTEE

Pauanui Pre-School not for profit community based centre registered with the New Zealand Charities Commission. The centre is managed by a parent run and elected Board of Trustees. This committee is governed by policy management in line with the Ministry of Education Early Childhood regulations. All positions are held by our parent body, and your participation is essential to maintain and run our Centre.

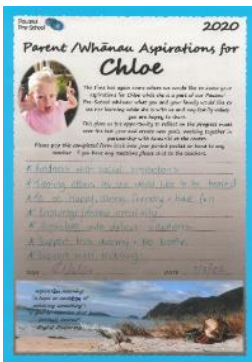

As a registered charity fundraising is an important part of Pauanui Pre-School. If you have any fundraising ideas, please chat with us or pop along to any of our Committee meetings.

POLICIES

To ensure that we comply with MOE (Ministry of Education) Regulations and government legislation, we are required to establish Policies specific to our Centre. The parent committee is dedicated in their efforts with regards to Policies, and manuals containing these and other general information.

As required by the MOE we follow a strict review timetable of these documents and we encourage all enrolled families to participate in this review process - this is your opportunity to make amendments or recommendations of proposed changes. We value your input to the running of our Centre.

PARENT / WHĀNAU ASPIRATION FORMS



Shortly after enrolling with us you will receive a parent/whānau aspiration form for your child/children.

This is to be completed by you so we can get to know your child/children and what you and your family would like to see your child/children learning at Pauanui Pre-School as well as any family values you are happy to share.

This gives us the opportunity to reflect on the progress made and to create new goals working together in partnership with whānau and tamariki at the centre.

COMMUNICATION

We aim to keep you regularly updated with Pre-School's events and other information and use Storypark, newsletters, email and texts. Notes may be left in the comment sections of the sign-in sheet or the centre diary to see a staff member if required.

ABSENCES

Please phone or text our centre phone if your child is absent. If you know you are going to be away on a certain day please inform us or write it in the centre diary next to the sign in sheet.

Pauanui Pre-School must adhere to MOE funding rules regarding absences. There are limits on how long funding will continue to be paid for children who are enrolled but who are absent. This means:

- a) Funding can be claimed for a maximum of three weeks absence.
- b) Funding can be claimed when the child's attendance matches their enrolment for at least half of each calendar month.



ARRIVALS AND DEPARTURES

Please ensure you arrive no earlier than 8.45am and your children are collected on time. Staff use the time before and after sessions as preparation and administration time. If you are going to be late when picking your child up, please phone or text message in advance to make arrangements.

In order to effectively monitor the where-abouts of each child at the centre it is necessary for the parent/caregiver to sign in when a child arrives, and sign out upon leaving. If your child is to be collected by someone other than yourself please record this in the daily diary found beside the sign in sheet.

FACEBOOK

Pauanui Pre-School has a Facebook page where we share special events, notices and photos of the children. Please notify us on your enrolment form if you do not wish for your child's photos to be uploaded to our Facebook page. We also have a private Facebook group which you can find by searching Pauanui Preschool Whanau.

PROFILE BOOKS



Every enrolled child is set up with a Profile Book. These contain observations and photographs of your child's learning and development and examples of their work.

We will invite you to share your perspective of your child as we believe the parents/caregivers know their children best. Children contribute their own perspectives and often document their own learning to these books.

You are welcome to take these books home, just let a teacher know and bring it back promptly so we can keep adding to it.

In addition to our Profile books, Pauanui Pre-School uses a web based ePortfolio program called Storypark, Storypark is designed in consultation with education experts to help teachers deepen relationships with family and work together to extend learning.

We love parents, whānau and caregivers to contribute their own perspective throughout these learning stories as it helps us form a more holistic record. Once you have enrolled your child you will be given access to your child's Storypark page.



CELEBRATIONS



We enjoy celebrating birthdays and with group mat time and singing songs. Please discuss with staff in advance if you would like to provide something to share to celebrate your child's birthday/farewell. No more than a cake please - this will be shared at morning tea.

We have a centre ritual when one of our Pre-School whanau leave the centre. A special mat time is had and the child leaving can opt to wear the centre korowai which was made by past children. Whānau are welcome to attend all celebrations.

CLOTHING

Play can be very messy – please dress your children in appropriate, named clothing, i.e. it will not matter if it is paint stained.

Please ensure your child has at least 2 changes of named clothes in their bag as well as a separate bag or wet bag to put soiled clothing in. If your child runs out of clean clothing we have a small supply of clothing at the Pre-School, if used please wash and return.

In the summer months please bring rash shirts, board shorts and a towel for water play.



SUN HATS AND SUNSCREEN



During hot weather, we recommend in conjunction with our Sun Safe policy, that children and teachers wear hats during term one and term four.

Sunscreen is also recommended and extra sunscreen lotion is available at Pre-School. Please apply sunscreen to your child prior to arriving at Pre-School and tick on the sign in sheet that you have done this. We will reapply sunscreen after lunch.

FOOD

Please provide morning tea and lunch for your child in a clearly named lunchbox. Morning tea is at 10.30am and lunch is at 12.30pm.

We are happy to heat any food for your child, please place this in the fridge container on the food trolley in the morning along with anything you wish to be refrigerated. All fruit/food should be in lunch boxes as it is intended to be eaten - due to early childhood food regulations teachers are not able to cut up food for children.

At Pauanui Pre-school we are committed to providing a safe and healthy environment for children to eat and drink throughout the day. We promote healthy eating | hauora kai messages to parents, whānau and Kaiako.

We recommend parents and whanau read the following information before enrolling in regards to providing safe food for your child/children.

SLEEPING

We have a separate sleep room which is air conditioned to maintain a comfortable temperature during summer and winter sleeping up to 8 children. 4 cots are available for babies and 4 beds for toddlers.

If your child is sleeping at Pauanui Pre-School we will work closely with you to establish a familiar sleeping routine with a primary carer. Please feel free to bring any sleep comforters such as a blanket, book, dummy, or a favourite toy to help settle your child.

As per Ministry requirements a teacher will be with your child until they fall asleep, after that we physically check sleeping children every 10 minutes. We also have a sleep monitor camera set up to ensure we are aware if children wake during this 10-minute interval. A record is kept of the time your child goes to sleep and then when they wake.



BEHAVIOUR MANAGEMENT

Having up to 25 children of mixed ages per session, it is essential to have an effective behavioural management strategy. At Pauanui Pre-School we handle such situations by:

- Making clear to the children the behaviour we expect from them
- Reinforcing their good behaviour in some way, this may be by praise, and lots of encouragement.
- Intervening to disrupt inappropriate behaviour and redirecting the children.
- Encouraging children to resolve their conflict through peaceful means
- Promoting sharing and co-operative behaviour.
- Our Social Competencies Policy can be found in the parent library at any time

CHANGING AND TOILETING

Please provide named nappies for your child and place these in the nappy tray in the children's bathroom. Pauanui Pre-School provides wipes. Should you wish for special wipes or nappy creams to be used on your child please provide these to a teacher clearly named.

As your child reaches the stage of independent toileting, the teaching staff will work closely with you and your child. Please feel free to discuss your toileting plans with our friendly teaching team.

SKILLS FOR SCHOOL

The Pre-School programme, routines and environment naturally incorporate many wonderful, authentic learning opportunities supporting children's skills for journeying off to school.

Children build practical skills and confidence to take responsibility for their belongings and self-care abilities. Our daily mat-time encourages the sharing of information, listening skills and enjoyment of participating, as we enjoy fun waiata, music and movement, stories and much more. Teachers spontaneously extend upon the children's knowledge of literacy and numeracy within their everyday play. Our environment is rich in literacy tools and print, with routines encouraging children to recognise and learn to write their name.

We have a reciprocal relationship with Hikuai School providing our 4-year-old tamariki opportunities to visit the new entrant classroom becoming familiar with the Hikuai School environment.



CHILD ILLNESS

We aim to ensure that the health and wellbeing of each child is protected at Pre-School by minimising the risk of infectious diseases spreading at Pauanui Pre-School. All practicable steps are taken to ensure that children do not come into contact with any person (adult or child) on the premises who is suffering from a disease or condition likely to be passed onto children and likely to have a detrimental effect on them.

KEY WELLNESS INDICATORS

Children should stay home or will be sent home from Pauanui Pre-School when they are ill with any of the following conditions:

- **Vomiting/Diarrhoea** - unless the child only vomited once and the reason to be caused by a non-communicable condition. When diarrhoea/vomiting is accompanied by any other symptoms such as fever, stomach pains, nausea, or headache, this indicates a gastrointestinal infection, and the child must stay home until they have been symptom free for at least 48 hours
- **Respiratory Infection** - No child can attend if they develop a new runny nose, sore throat, cough, fever, are off their food and drink or show any other symptoms of a respiratory infection. If the child has a runny nose where they difficulty controlling the spread of nasal secretions and/or has a negative social impact upon the child the child must stay home. Children can return to Pre-School 24 hours after they have significantly improved and are behaving/eating normally.
- **Fever** - Any child with a fever over 38°C cannot attend Pre-School and must stay home until they have been symptom free for 24 hours. Children with a temperature over 40°C – Kaiako must advise parents that the child must be taken to their family doctor or emergency room.
- **Rash /Mouth Sores/Skin Infections** - child must stay home until your family Doctor has determined that the illness is not a communicable disease.
- **Conjunctivitis** - Child must stay home until there is no discharge from the eyes.
- **Covid-19** - No child can attend if they have tested positive to Covid-19. Children can return to Pre-School 24 hours after they are symptom free and and are behaving/eating normally.
- Any illness that prevents the child from participating comfortably in programme activities or results in greater care needed than Pre-School can reasonably provide without compromising the health and safety of the other children
- Anyone suffering from an infectious or notifiable disease as outlined in <https://health.govt.nz/products/infectious-diseases-1>

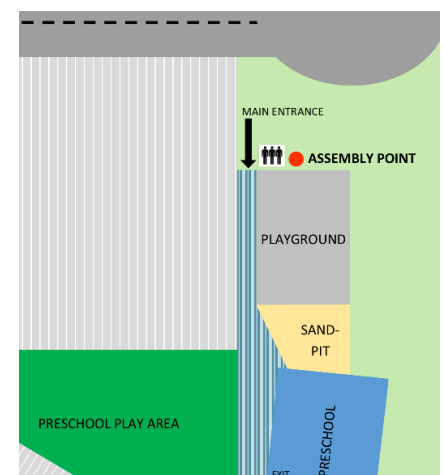
If your child becomes ill at Pre-School we will phone you to collect your child. To reduce the spread of infectious diseases teachers will sit with your child on the couch in the reading corner where the sick child can be temporarily kept at a safe distance from other children (to prevent cross-infection) and lie down.

EMERGENCY PROCEDURES

We practice regular emergency evacuations with the children each month for fire, earthquakes/tsunami and lockdown.

Our designated meeting point is against the fence of the playground outside Pre-School, if it unsafe to remain there our secondary meeting point is Pauanui Sports & Recreation Club.

In the event of evacuation due to Tsunami our meeting point is Panorama Parade. Emergency procedures are displayed on the notice board and available via Storypark. Please take time to familiarise yourself with these.
